



**Cédric Vergère** naît en Valais dans une famille de musiciens de Brass Band. C'est tout naturellement qu'il commence la musique de cuivre, intègre à 10 ans les rangs de la fanfare de son village, la *Concordia de Vétroz*, et profite des conseils de son père et de son grand-père tromboniste pour débuter sa carrière musicale.

Il s'inscrit ensuite à l'Ecole de musique de Géo-Pierre Moren, directeur du célèbre *Brass Band 13 Etoiles*, ensemble qu'il rejoindra 6 ans plus tard. C'est durant ces années qu'il participe à divers concours de solistes, où il remporte de nombreux prix (3 fois champion valaisan de trombone, 5 fois champion suisse de trombone, 1<sup>er</sup> prix du concours SSEW de Langenthal, Swiss Entertainment Solo Champion).

Désirant parfaire l'étude de son instrument, il suit 4 ans de cours au Conservatoire de Lausanne avec David Bruchez et Gérard Boudry, et obtient son Certificat d'études supérieures, parallèlement à des études universitaires de psychologie.

Toujours en recherche constante de perfectionnement, Cédric suit de nombreuses *masterclasses* et cours privés qui lui permettront de bénéficier de l'enseignement et des conseils de grands trombonistes, comme Christian Lindberg, Armin Bachmann, Dany Bonvin et Jacques Mauger.

En 2008, il enregistre en soliste son CD *Slide Odyssey* sous le label Marcophon, où il se produit au trombone ténor ainsi qu'au trombone basse. Il se produit également en soliste, surtout avec des camps de jeunes, l'été, tels que le Jugend Brass Band Ostschweiz ou le Jugend Brass Band Graubünden.

Actuellement, Cédric Vergère dirige la fanfare *L'Avenir* de Chamoson ainsi que *La Cécilia* de Chermignon. Il s'investit également dans la composition et dans la formation des jeunes.
